Student Learning Outcomes and Course Objectives

Students will participate in the Bloom's Taxonomy Hierarchy with learning procedures that address the highest levels of mastery with regard to teaching methods, lesson plan design and execution, budget preparation, and in the development of a classroom management plan.

Students will observe and reflect on current secondary school teaching practices.

Students will critically analyze the work of contemporary artists.

Students will integrate art historical education with multiple delivery components in teaching practices.

Students will reflect on their teaching practices in order to gain significant perspective of their performance.

Students will evaluate differing learning styles and any needs for accommodation therein and design strategies for addressing those needs.

Teaching Strategies

My teaching style involves presentation of information through diverse delivery methods incorporating lecture, video presentation, guest lecture, discussion, active learning, demonstration, role playing, readings, and student presentation. Whenever possible, I try to engage my students to collaborate with one another and engage in peer teaching practices for greater retention. Group work is expected in many lecture settings as well. Students are encouraged to participate in the learning experience as actively as possible through teaching activities (presentation in class), project based activities (creating, synthesizing), and by field experience (observations, exhibitions, excursions from the classroom).

Pay attention to deadlines and be sure to have all observations scheduled early in the semester to avoid scheduling conflicts.
